2022 ArmyU Learning Symposium Overview



Symposium Purpose: Biennial event to inform and further develop partnerships between military, government, academic and industry partners on the Army's People First, Army Modernization, and Talent Management Strategy's, and establish discourse on the new CJCS guidance for Outcomes Based Military Education.

Audience: Academia, Industry, Professional Military Educators as well as subject matter experts from across the Army Learning Enterprise (ALE).

Location: Lewis & Clark Center and Virtual Blackboard Collaborate

End state: Establish collaborative relationships that support the ArmyU mission. Relationships support learning enterprise programs and initiatives, learning sciences research, and realization of the Army Learning Concept 2030-2040.






2022 Army University Learning Symposium

2022 ArmyU Learning Symposium Theme and Topic Areas



'Modernizing Military Learning'

People— Includes Personalized Learning And Faculty And Staff Development. Example Topics Include Self-regulated Learning, Peer-to-peer Learning, Tailored Learning, Learner Engagement, etc.

Modernization – Effective Application Of Learning Science, Particularly For Technology-Enabled Learning and Learning Ecosystem Contexts. Example Topics Include Learning Science For The Future, Learning Strategies And Tactics For New Education Or Training Platforms, Learning Theory Related To Data-driven Learning, Adaptive Training And Education, Immersive / Virtual / Augmented Reality, Simulations, APPS, And Classrooms Of The Future.

Talent Management – Addresses Talent Focused Assessments, KSB Development, And Credentialed Learning. Example Topics Include Learner Profiles In Practice, Competency And Credentialing Management, Credit For Military Learning And Vocational Credentialing.

Annual Topic – Outcomes Based Education

A Chairman Of The Joint Staff Initiative - The Professional Military Education Vision For 21st Century Joint Leader Development Is A Fully Aligned PME/Talent Management System That Develops Leaders Who Are Skilled In The Art Of War And The Practical And Ethical Application Of Lethal Military Power. Joint PME Is Shifting To An Outcomes-based Military Education (OBME) Approach Emphasizing Student Achievement Of Course Learning Outcomes.

- The program agenda included 23 presentations available online through the ArmyUniversity.edu site. Facilitated chat sessions were hosted for each of the virtual presentations, providing the opportunity to 'talk' to the presenters.
- There were an additional 16 live presentations that included the virtual audience and were recorded available online through the ArmyUniversity.edu site.
- 313 virtual and 80 registered participants.
- Over 1,000 professionals participated: more than 950 virtual participants and over 80 in-person participants.



Follow-on initiatives already identified include:

- Piloting Academic Rigor assessment tools
- Exploring opportunities to Augment Military Instructors with talented Army Civilians
- Exploring Artificial Intelligence integration with training development workflow
- Exploring the development of new Army Learning doctrine

 - Mapping Assessments to Competencies
 - Assessments of Systems Thinking
 - Enhancing Creativity-related Competencies
 - Linguistics and Text Analysis collaborations




